# STORY REPORT FORM

This form should accompany the stories of challenge / change that you collected from your partners, stakeholders, staff, community members and volunteers (one form for each story). The stories themselves can be written up or take the form of photos, short videos, drawings, poetry, etc.

**Name of the organisation and person collecting the story:**

e.g. the story was collected for CCIVS by Francesco, who works as a consultant on impact assessment and was visiting for the first time the village of Padola

**Who provided the story and in which form:**

e.g. the story was shared in the form of a drawing by Gianni, a 15yo boy who attends the local middle school in the village of Padola

**When and where did the challenges/changes illustrated in the story take place:**

e.g. the story relates challenges/changes concerning the small mountain village of Padola, in the Italian alps, and refers to the summer of 2022 when several cows stopped producing milk and even died because of the excessive heat

**What kind of projects were implemented by your organisation in the place the story refers to :**

e.g. CCIVS has run several Climate Justice campaigns in the village of Padola between 2020 and 2023, involving teachers , pupils and shepherds from the area

**What does the storyteller believe is the significance of the events described in the story?**

e.g. Gianni explained that his family owned cows for 5 generations: the excessive heat of 2022 made it impossible to use the mountain pastures that traditionally host the cows during the summer months, pushing them to choose between bringing the cows at even higher altitudes, with the risk of not finding enough food for them, or putting the milk production and even the life of the cows at risk by facing the heat (see the dead cows and lost cows in the right part of the drawing). At the same time, tourists increased, and his family attempted to complement its livelihood through offering hosting and restoration, but struggled to communicate with the tourists the importance of respecting the local pastures and woods that became infested with plastic waste.
