Women with Water Buckets and Power

In Kpalimé, women farmers face water scarcity, plastic pollution, and climate stress. But with support from **ASTOVOT** and LIVE-Ex volunteers, they're flipping the script.

What they're doing:

-  Restoring riverbanks for irrigation
-  Piloting drip irrigation systems
-  Launching plastic reduction campaigns
-  Replanting trees to stabilize ecosystems

This is what frontline climate adaptation looks like — local, female-led, and fierce.
