Because justice — environmental, social, and political — is not a slogan. It's a right.

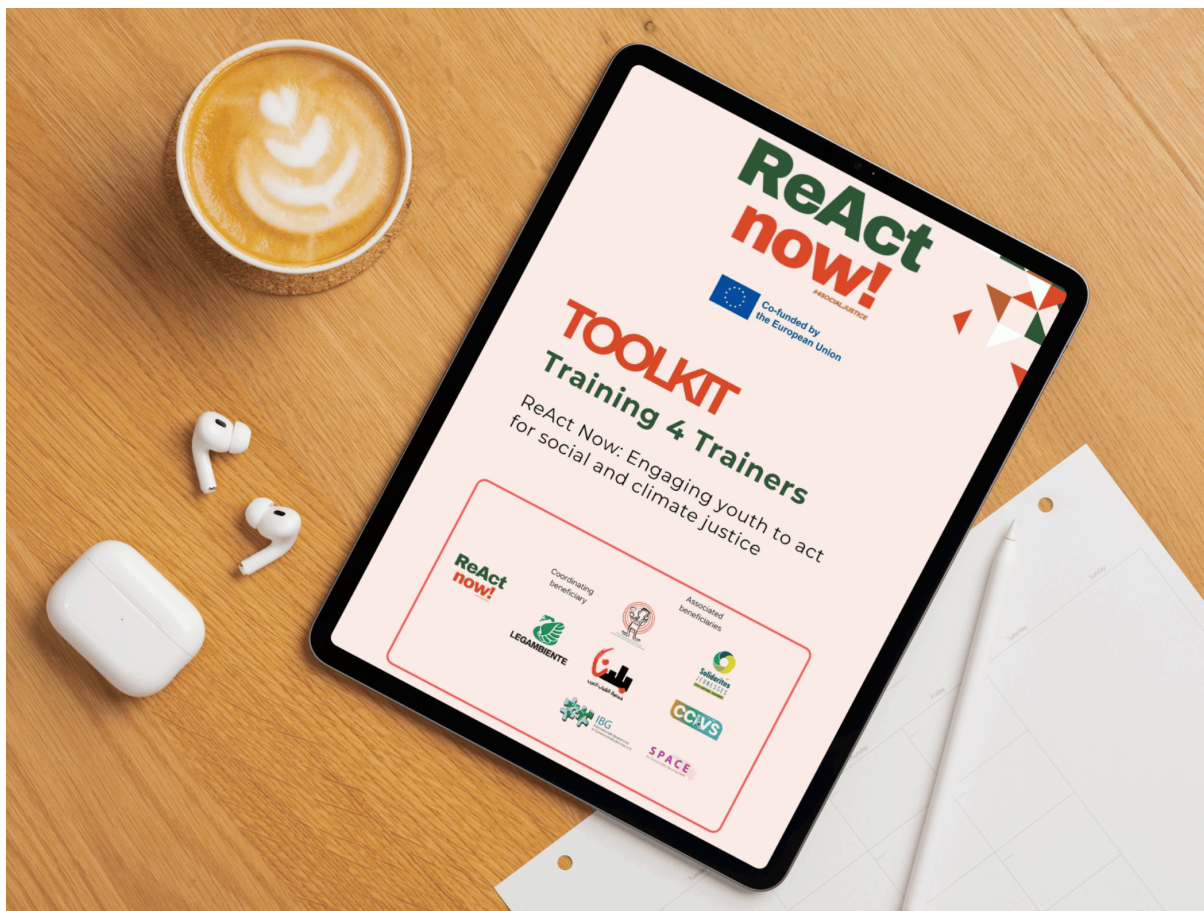


New Release: The ReAct Now Toolkit is here!

actions in their communities — reaching over 120 young people across six countries. If you want to participate and you live in one of these countries, reply to this e-mail so we can match you with the local organisation.

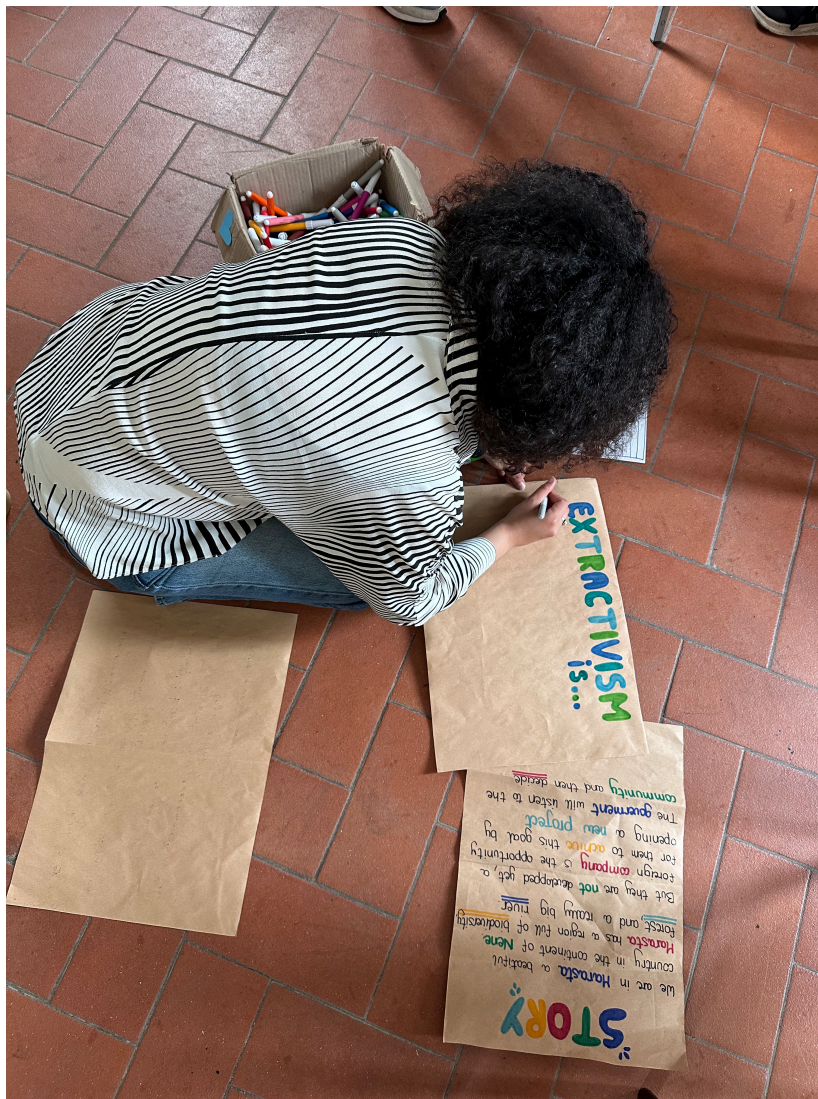
“I wasn’t expecting this much. It was my first time in such a training, and I felt overwhelmed — but also deeply accomplished.” — Participant from Jordan
