



Carbon credits, explained in plain words (free online session)

Carbon credits sound complicated. We'll make them simple.

What they are:

1 credit = **1 tonne of CO₂** avoided or removed.

What to avoid:

Greenwashing, double counting, weak data, and projects that don't help people.

What to do instead:

Reduce first. If you still use credits, apply a **short quality check**:

Is it **real** (additional)?

Will it **last** (permanence)?

Is it **independently checked** (MRV) and **not counted twice**?

Do **communities agree and benefit** (FPIC/fair share)?
