



Become an Earth Advocate with LIVE-Ex!

Do you care about what is happening to the land, water and people in your community, and want to do something real about it?

The **LIVE-Ex Earth Advocacy Mentorship** brings together a small group of young people and youth workers who meet online, learn together, and design local actions for climate and environmental justice.

This is not about being an expert or having the right words. It is about caring, listening, and trying something meaningful where you live.

What happens in the mentorship?

Through online sessions inspired by the LIVE-Ex mentorship handbook, you will:

- explore what Earth Advocacy and climate justice mean in your own context
- share what is happening to land, soil, water, forests, food or air in your community
- use simple tools to design one local action that fits your reality
(for example: a small campaign, workshop, community clean-up, tree planting with purpose, or an art or music action)
- learn basic advocacy and fundraising skills
- connect with young people and youth workers from different countries

The journey begins with an **online Launch Session on 20 January 2026**, and continues with in-country launches and local or online sessions organised by LIVE-Ex partners.

Who can apply?

We welcome:

- young people (around 18–30, flexible)
- youth workers and volunteers from LIVE-Ex partner organisations and the CCIVS/ICYE network
- people from communities affected by environmental injustice or climate impacts

You do not need perfect English. You may also use French, Portuguese, Swahili or other languages, with local support depending on the context.

Our partners are based in **Tanzania, South Africa, Togo, Kenya, Nigeria, Malawi, Zimbabwe and Mozambique**.
